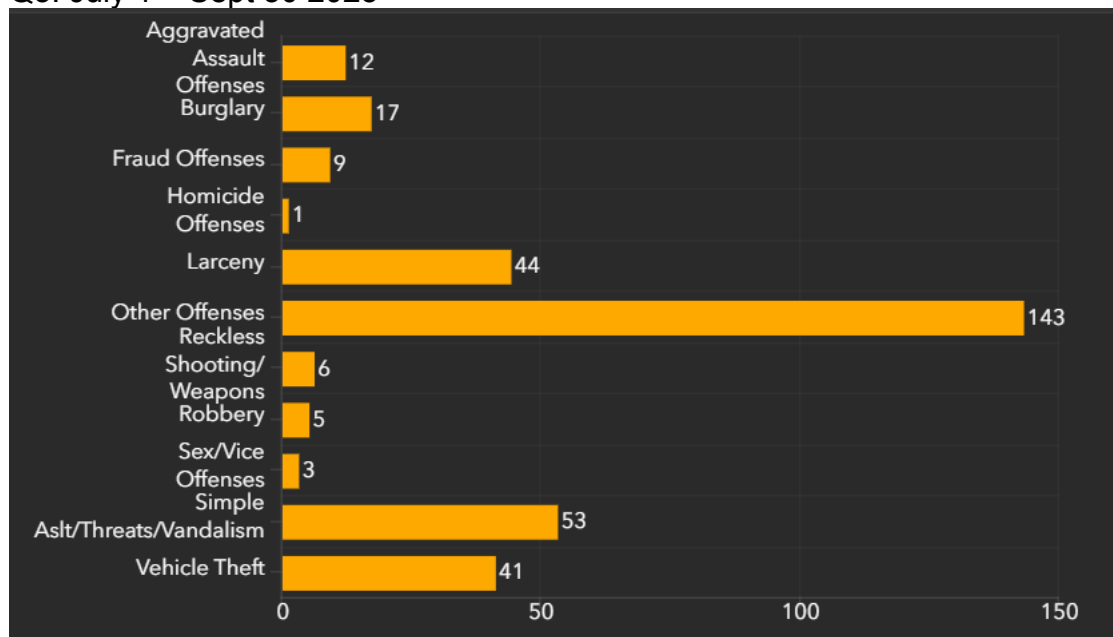


****For reference: Q3 refers to Quarter 3, which is July to September and Q4 is Quarter 4 which is October to December. Both also refer to the months in 2025.****

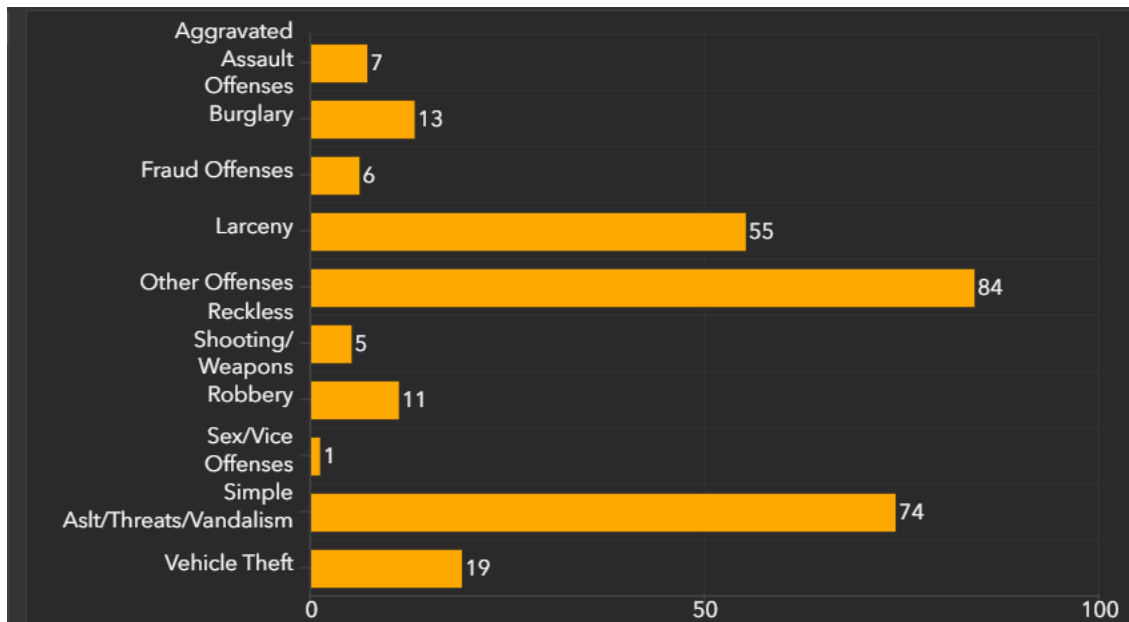
In general, the number of all types of crimes being called in are **down** with only a few exceptions:

- Larcenies went up from 44 to 55 from Q3 to Q4 (Pickpocketing, Shoplifting, Thefts from buildings or Vehicles. Typically seen in grocery stores or discount stores.)
- Robberies went up from 5 to 11 from Q3 to Q4
- Simple Assault/Threats/Vandalism went up from 53 to 74 from Q3 to Q4

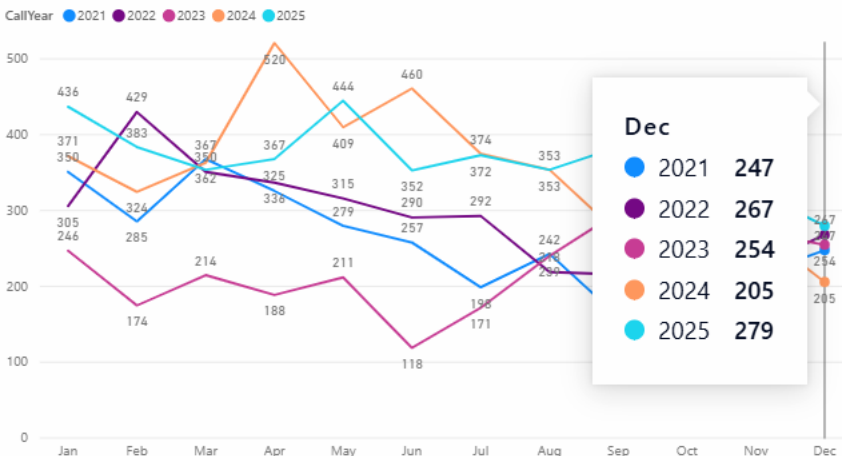

Stats are based on the date the report was created. Homicides are entered manually regardless of approval status and may not be as current.

- The above information is for all of Precinct 4's Unincorporated areas for all of 2025 which includes White Center, Skyway, and Vashon Island. Numbers do not reflect just our area but still show a general trend of a decrease in most criminal activity. Focusing on the right side of the above chart, virtually every type of crime is down with a few exceptions. Homicide Investigations and Drug offenses are the only categories of crimes that have increased throughout all of last year.

On Views Five Year Comparison



- The above chart displays on-view calls for 2025 – 279 vs. previous years 2024/23 of 205 and 254 respectfully. On-view calls are ones that are initiated by deputies. Things that they see when they are out and about on patrol or something they want to investigate. This year has been the most productive year for deputies in being proactive and being out in the community trying to solve problems they've seen.

On a separate topic:

White Center has an unhoused population that can be seen revolving in and out of the limits of White Center all the time. These specific individuals are not any reason as to why certain crimes have risen but I have heard rumblings that folks believe they are the cause of most of the crime. While their situations and intentions promote the image that they are the cause of crime, the need to remind the public is there that normal people commit similar crimes as well.

For the issue of unhoused (homeless) individuals, also abandoned vehicles and similar reports, we do have 2 designated traffic cars that handle as much of those issues as they can. They chisel down the list of abandoned vehicles as fast as they can and move those along who are living in RVs and those who are camping as often as possible. They cannot keep these individuals out forever and they tend to drift back over time, but as many vehicles as I see or as many that get reported to me, they are always forwarded to our traffic cars and followed up on to see if the issue has been resolved.

Do not stop reporting abandoned vehicles, RVs with growing trash problems, or anything you feel you need to report. **Always use the non-emergency line (206-296-3311)** if you want to speak to a call taker and to ask if there are any other ways to report or have us try to help deal with any issues you have. For all other issues, report them online via the reporttosheriff.org link and find the appropriate issue from the list provided. You can also send me an email with any of those issues **after** you've initially reported and I can do my best to have someone follow up or prioritize issues as best as we can.
